WFP LIBYA

2025 A YEAR IN REVIEW

Highlights

- WFP Libya's humanitarian response in 2025 shifted towards the Sudanese crisis as refugees' arrivals reached 514,000, more than double the 2024 figure. In response, WFP scaled up operations and supported 240,913 Sudanese refugees and local host communities with emergency and cash food assistance.
- Nutrition support expanded significantly, with WFP nearly doubling coverage, reaching 35,609 children and pregnant and breastfeeding women and girls.
- WFP phased out the six-year school feeding programme in May, which was implemented and financed by WFP, in coordination with the ministry of Education. A total of 15,040 students from 33 schools benefitted from the programme in 2025 receiving daily meals.
- WFP rehabilitated five community bakeries supporting around 450 households and restored critical water infrastructure in southern Libya—including desalination units, wells, and solar power systems—benefiting over 150,000 people.

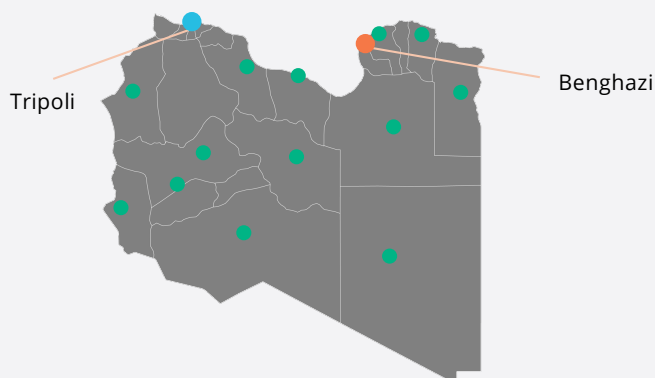

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Strategic outcome 01

Food assistance to Sudanese refugees and Libyan host communities.



240,913 Sudanese Refugees and host community members

were assisted with **4,595 mt** of In-Kind food and cash-based transfers.

5,700 metric tons of

food crossed the Libya-Chad WFP facilitated humanitarian corridor.

35,609 children under five and Sudanese mothers were supported through WFP's malnutrition prevention programme.

Strategic outcome 02

Vulnerable communities in Libya have improved resilience and stability.



15,040 School children in 33 schools across Derna received daily school meals to ensure continued learning while creating 56 jobs.

150,000 people benefited from the **Water-Food nexus project**, which included **installation of solar powered energy systems** supporting water supply infrastructure in the south of Libya.

FIVE bakeries were rehabilitated in Al-Qatroun, supporting around 450 families in the local host community and Sudanese refugee community.

Strategic outcome 04

Humanitarian and development partners have enhanced ability to support vulnerable populations in Libya in anticipation of, during and in the aftermath of crises.



UN Benghazi Hub accommodated **108** humanitarian personnel from ten different UN agencies, totalling **2,807** overnight stays.

WFP continued to provide **vital ICT services** in the UN Benghazi Hub, deploying equipment for **field connectivity, internet, and helpdesk support**.

In 2025, WFP completed the expansion of the **UN Benghazi Hub** with new office facilities and suites. The hub can now host 96 staff members, up from 40.
