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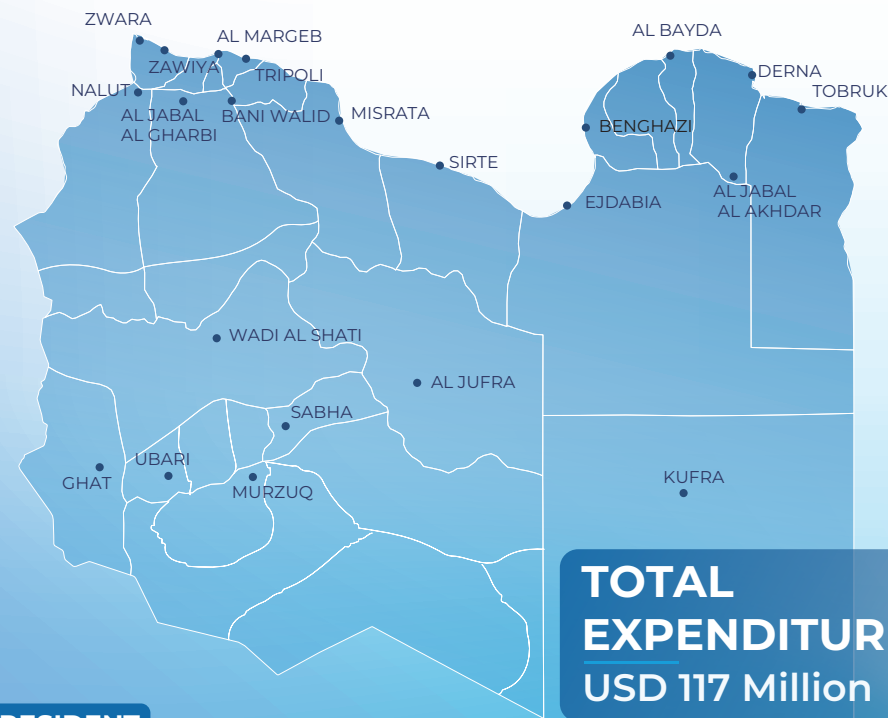

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1 PILLAR PEACE AND GOVERNANCE

-  Successful municipal elections in 58 municipalities
-  Targeted advocacy increased women's voter registration to 29% and facilitated 42% of new registrations within a month
-  Launch of UN-facilitated, Libyan-owned, and led political process
-  Facilitating the resolution of the Central Bank of Libya leadership crisis
-  Support for the drafting of the Reconciliation Law and the Freedom of Association Law
-  Creation of a National Legal Reform Committee to modernise laws on forensics and human identification

2 PILLAR SUSTAINABLE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

-  10,181 individuals gained improved capacity and expertise for economic opportunities, including in technology and innovation
-  Launch of 140 start-ups across nine municipalities
-  Technical and financial assistance provided to 70 SMEs
-  504 youth including 204 women, benefited from targeted mentorship

3 PILLAR SOCIAL AND HUMAN CAPITAL DEVELOPMENT

-  Developing a digital health transformation roadmap with phased plans towards Universal Health Coverage
-  Endorsing the One Health Memorandum of Understanding, across eight government ministries
-  Delivering health services to 2 million people through 59 primary healthcare facilities
-  1.2 million children under six received vaccinations
-  614 teachers adopting inclusive education techniques to better support children with disabilities
-  20,000 children benefiting from the school-feeding programme
-  Finalising the Libya National Mental Health Strategy 2025–2030
-  103,000 individuals benefiting from mental health and psychosocial support services

4 PILLAR CLIMATE CHANGE, ENVIRONMENT AND WATER

-  Support for the launch of the National Sustainable Energy Strategy 2035
-  Introducing a water-optimisation system for the Man-Made River Authority to increase water supply to hard-to-reach areas, including Jabal Nafusa
-  Ensuring access to safe water for 185,000 people in the flood-affected areas
-  Advancing the implementation of the Montreal Protocol through the digitalisation of registration systems and capacity-building of 220 officials

1 OUTCOME DURABLE SOLUTIONS FOR IDPS

-  A catalytic study and the training of 505 individuals on Housing, Land, and Property (HLP) rights in support of Tawerghan IDPs and returnees
-  14 businesses and 80 households in flood-affected areas benefited from targeted business opportunities
-  303,047 IDPs and host communities gained access to education, renewable energy, and other public spaces
-  Launch of the interministerial Task Force on Durable Solutions for IDPs led by MoLG, to drive systematic and coordinated action to end internal displacement

2 OUTCOME MIGRATION MANAGEMENT

-  Launch of a comprehensive Libyan Chapter of the Sudan Emergency Regional Refugee Response Plan
-  Life-saving humanitarian assistance to vulnerable migrants – 250,000 food assistance, 134,000 non-food items, 241,771 medical consultations and 5,589 child protection services
-  Facilitating technical discussions between the Government and Chad on the Bilateral Labour Agreement
-  Supporting 16,210 migrants and 355 persons of concern departure from Libya through voluntary humanitarian return and humanitarian corridors programmes
